


# 윷놀이

# Yut Nori



**Yut-Nori ('Nori' means 'game') is a traditional board game played in Korea, especially during Korean New Year.**



## What you need:

- 4 lollipop sticks (rectangles of thick cardboard will also work)
- Print out the board at the end of the instructions (or draw your own)
- 2 sets of four "mal" or tokens. The two sets must be different, try using pieces from a game like Ludo or silver and copper coins.

## Preparation:

Yut Nori uses Yut sticks instead of dice. Decorate one side of your lollipop sticks and leave the other side blank. On **ONE** of the lollipops draw a dot in the centre of the blank side. On your turn you will throw the sticks in the air and how they land determines how far you go.

## How to play:


The game has a few different versions for different ages. We suggest you try the easier versions if only for a few turns before trying the more complex versions to help you understand the rules.

## Using Yut Sticks


On your teams turn, throw the four sticks in the air and allow them to land in front of you.

The different ways they can land have different names and tell you how far you can move this turn. An easy way to remember this is to count how many blank sides are showing. That tells you how many steps you can take that turn. If there are no blank sides then you get to step 5 spaces.



DO

1 point to step



GAE

2 points to step




GEOL

3 points to step



YUT

4 points to step and cast again



MO

5 points to step and cast again

If you throw a Yut or a Mo you get another turn! There is no limit to how many turns you get in a row if you can keep throwing Yuts and Mos.
